MORNING TIME ON THE PORCH

SERMON SUMMARY

on 6:1- Revelation 6:3-4

Monday 6/3 - Revelation 6:1-2 "Deception." Read Jeremiah 30:7, Daniel 12:1, Revelation 13:8 and Matthew 24:4-8.

Tuesday, 6/4 - Revelation 6:2 "Rider of the White Horse vs Description of Jesus." Read Revelation 2:12, Revelation 19:11, 15, Revelation 6:1, Ephesians 6:17, John 1:1, and John 8:44.

Wednesday, 6/5 - II Thessalonians 2:5-9 "Holy Spirit as Restrainer." Read II Thessalonians 2:1, Matthew 5:13-16, I Thessalonians 4:16 and I Thessalonians 5:8.

Thursday, 6/6 - I Thessalonians 2:12-13 "Our Conduct as Christians." Read Matthew 11:28, I John 3:14, Galatians 5:13, and I Peter 2:9..

Friday, 6/7 - None.

Pastor Art continued his walk through the Book of Revelation with a sermon entitled "The Red Horse of Destruction" based on Revelation 6:3-4. Understanding the book of Revelation is one of the reasons why we prioritize coming to church and sharing the Good News. We need to keep our focus on Christ! In this passage the second seal is opened and the red horse appears. Satan disrupts the apple cart. The horse is fiery red which represents war and destruction. Pastor Art shifted his focus to talk about the 4 beasts who speak with the opening of the seals. It is his belief that these beasts represent the four gospel writers, who recorded the truth. Each beast says "Come and See." The first beast is pictured as a lion, which portrays the book of Matthew. The second beast is pictured as a calf. The third beast has the face of a man and represents Luke, who was a gentile doctor. The fourth beast is pictured as an eagle, which is fierce and bold, an apt description for John. All four represent the truth.

Pastor Art read Revelation 6:1-4. He reminded us that the peace brought by the Antichrist was false and short lived. He followed this with a passage from Matthew 24:4-7. When Christ returns he brings everlasting peace to reign in the millenium. To give us an idea of how devastating the opening of the second seal is. Pastor Art shared that combining WWI, WWII, and Vietnam War - 93 million people died. The red horse represents a time of horrific unrest with 25% of the world's population
