MORNING TIME ON THE PORCH

SERMON SUMMARY

Revelation 6:7-8 – 4th Horseman of the Apocalypse

Monday 6/17 - Colossians 1:16-18 "Reflecting God." Read Daniel 6.

Tuesday, 6/11 - None.

Wednesday, 6/19 - I Thessalonians 5:16-18 "United in Prayer." Read Matthew 6:5-8, John 11:9, and John 8:12.

Thursday, 6/20 - Matthew 13:31-32 "Planting Seeds." Read Psalm 23:6.

Friday, 6/14 - Isaiah 54:10 "God's Covenant." Read Proverbs 3:5-6 and Zephaniah 3:17.

Pastor Art continued his sermon series from the book of Revelation with a sermon entitled: "Fourth Horseman of the Apocalypse," based on Revelation 6:7-8. The fourth horseman lays out the importance of preparing for the tribulation by revealing the light of Christ. As a precursor to the message, he asked the question "Why do we study the scriptures?" Then he directed our attention to Paul's letter to his protege Timothy. Read II Timothy 3:1, 12-13, 16. Iron sharpens iron. Bible study sharpens us. The Bible speaks clearly every time you open it.

Persecution, trials and tribulations are all present in our world but remain a precursor for what is to come as revealed in the book of Revelation. Then Pastor Art reviewed the four horses of the apocalypse. The first was the white horse, which represents deception. The second was the fiery red horse representing war. The third was the black horse representing famine. The last one, the pale horse, represents death. The Greek word representing this horse was 'chloro,' which was the color of rotting flesh. With the release of this horseman, 25% of the world is slaughtered immediately. The scripture notes that Hades follows this horseman. Hades is not hell. It is merely a holding place for the wicked awaiting final judgement. But it is a place of torment and fire. Satan desires the souls of the unbelievers. Read Luke 16:19-31 and Ezekiel 14:21. What are we doing to tell others about the Good News? The evangelist, Billy Graham, stated that it was not God's intent that any


PRAYING FOR ISRAEL NIGHT AND DAY

UPDATE FROM NEW HOPE MISSIONS INTERNATIONAL

What a joy to share with you the progress NHMI is making in advancing kingdom service in Haiti through quality education. FYI. Mandatory government exams for 9th and 13th grades are scheduled for August 8th which means students will still have about 6 weeks to study in final preparation to achieve their certification for graduation into secondary school or from secondary school itself. By His grace we are making a profound and lasting impact empowering the Next Generation of Christian leaders to break the cycle of poverty and build a better tomorrow. Because evangelism and discipleship remain at the heart of our core focus, our field pastoral staff have sensed and obeyed the call of God to collectively evangelize the area in and around the NHMI church community of Barrier Battant for the last month. A victorious pastoral text read, "Last Saturday 15 people accepted Jesus Christ as Savior which brings the Gospel message to those who believe to 174 people. We thank you for your prayer and support. May God bless you abundantly."



DIALOGUE & PRAYER FROM NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER TASK FORCE

Throughout the Gospels we see that Jesus filled His conversations with questions. Some were rhetorical, challenging listeners to ponder the underlying truth, while others were direct, intended to bring to light what is in a person's heart and mind. Jesus modeled for us how we might go about inviting others into meaningful conversations that can lead to spiritual conversations. When we ask genuine questions, the other person is invited to get their ideas, the thought processes, or the beliefs out in the open - out into the light.

When we progress in a conversation, we might thoughtfully respond, and ask a question that could reveal their attitude toward God:

- Have you ever considered what the Bible says about that topic? Why or why not?
- That sounds like a deep hurt in your life. Do you feel like you can experience love from God?
- You seem really worried about this situation. Would you mind if I prayed for you right now?

You might also consider the same questions Jesus posed:

- What have you heard about Jesus?
- What do you believe about Jesus?

Our Christian brothers and sisters need this type of question-based conversation and fellowship as well. They may be struggling with pride, fearfulness, or hopelessness. By asking questions, we can see the places where we can hold them accountable in striving towards righteousness, and where we can speak the truth of Scripture to further their walk with Christ. Consider questions like:

- -What have you been praying for in this situation?
- -Could we look at Scripture together to find verses that show God's will for us?

-Are fear and worry dominating your thought process here?

When we ask these heart-revealing questions, we have the opportunity to shine the light of Christ and fan the flame of faith!

"Lord Jesus, You are my Teacher, instructing me in all things, inviting me into relationship with You as You ask questions for me to share with You, and ultimately submit to You. I ask that You would fill me with courage, to step out of my comfort zone and engage others in conversation, asking questions that provide opportunity to shine Your light. Guide me in graciousness to respond with grace and truth when someone answers my question in a way that I disagree with. I want to live as a bold witness for You, demonstrating from the moment a conversation starts that You so loved each person in the world, You died for their sins, so anyone who believes can have eternal life with You. In Jesus' name, Amen."
