SERMON SUMMARY

Revelation 14:1-5 – Seeing and Hearing Part 2

Pastor Art prefaced his sermon by reading II Timothy 3:16 about all scripture is inspired by God. God presents us guidelines for living in His Holy Word. Then he moved into the fourteenth Chapter of Revelation with a sermon entitled "Seeing and Hearing Part 2" based on Revelations 14:1-5. It is important to preach the truth so that we are fully equipped to share the Bible with others. This scripture passage from Revelations 14 gives us a picture of what a Christian should look like. Praising God in worship is important. That's why Pastor Art chose Psalm 99 for our call to worship as it is a praise psalm. This is a picture of the first saved during the tribulation - sealed in Chapter 7 of Revelations. In verses 2 and 3, this praise and worship time reminds us of the sovereignty of God. John (author of Revelation) is getting not just a picture but one with sound effects. Read Revelation 15:3-4. This is the Song of Moses and it is filled with praise and reverence.

There are five applications from today's scripture passage (Rev 14:2-5). First, the mark of a triumphant Christian is how they live their life and how they acknowledge God and are blessed. As a Christ follower, you will experience trials but God goes with you because you are sealed through your relationship with Christ. Read Psalm 23:4-5, James 1:2-4, and I Peter 4:13. Even through times of trial and persecution, stay steadfast. Second, purity! Verse 4 states these ones are not defiled - pure. We will see the return of the fertility cults in the tribulation. The Holy Spirit will be removed at the rapture of the church. Read II Thessalonians 2:6-8a. The lawless one will be

The 144,000 became beacons of light in a dark world because they stayed true to God. Jesus is the answer. Read I Peter 1:15-16. They followed Jesus wherever He went. Sexual purity is essential to triumphant Christian living. Third, partisanship or party of the Lamb. Put everything into following the party of the Lamb. As a Christ follower, then we are called to follow Jesus, even denying yourself. Read Matthew 16:24, Matthew 19:21 and John 10:27. Loyal devoted followers of Jesus Christ will look like these 144,000. Read Ecclesiastes 1:9. Firstfruits in the Old Testament meant that the first was always given to God. Fourth, commitment. The 144,000 will exemplify purpose, decisiveness, dedication and clarity as marks of the life goals that make triumphant Christians. Read Romans 11:25-27 and Romans 12:1-2. Fifth, perfection. God sees you through a righteous veil because of the blood of Jesus Christ. Read Revelations 14:5 - no deceit. Standing on the truth - you don't ever have to lie. It is a pattern of triumphant Christian living. Read I Peter 1:1-16 and follow it. Praising God for a pastor unashamed of the gospel and willing to teach others the truth!

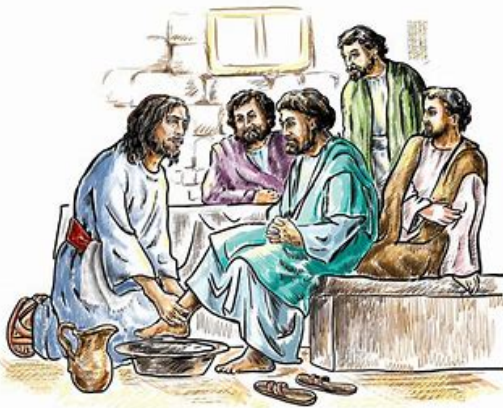
MOVIE NIGHT

MAUNDY THURSDAY PRAYER VIGIL

Maundy Thursday—also known as Holy Thursday and Sheer Thursday, among other names—is a Christian holy day that commemorates events known as the Washing of the Feet and the Last Supper. On its own, the word “*maundy*” means “the ceremony of washing the feet of the poor, especially commemorating Jesus’ washing of his disciples’ feet on Maundy Thursday.” During the Last Supper, Jesus washed the feet of his 12 disciples as they shared their final meal. The meaning of washing feet is layered: in the ancient world, a host would offer water for guests to wash their feet (sandals being the footwear of the day). So, washing feet is a sign of hospitality—of welcoming and care. It is also an act of humility, as servants often washed feet. The son of God, Jesus, is doing something so lowly to demonstrate humility. Christians have come to interpret Jesus’s washing of the feet as an illustration of a humble mission of service. The act has also come to symbolize the cleansing of sin from his fellow Christians—and so Jesus’s new commandment was urging his disciples to show forgiveness to all.
