Pastor Art announced that we were kicking off Holy Week and described it as the Superbowl for Christians. This week his sermon was entitled "Triumphal Entry of the Lamb," based on Mark 11:1-11. Jesus was returning to Jerusalem for Passover. To better understand Passover read chapter 12 of Exodus. Read Zechariah 9:9, which prophesied our scripture passage for today. Pastor Art

How do we live our lives in the celebration of Palm Sunday - the triumphal entry? How do we give back to the King? Are we ritualistic in our church attendance or are we passionately worshipping our God? Are we physically in church but not really present (distracted by the world)? These are all questions we need to ponder

It is emotional. True faith in Jesus is eternal. We will always celebrate the triumphal entry. Bethany had a special place in Jesus' life. It was the home of his good friends, Mary, Martha and Lazarus. Read Matthew 21:1-11.

The acquisition of the donkey happens in verses 4-6. There are two important takeaways from this scripture passage. First, it requires a willingness to be involved. Second, it hinges on you showing up. It is important to realize that this scripture sets up an example for us to follow. Jesus had already set up what would happen. But it all hinged on the disciples doing what he

## **EASTER AT OCC**

Easter is almost upon us. Palm Sunday is April 13. On Maundy Thursday, we will be having a 24 hour prayer vigil. More about Maundy Thursday in next week's newsletter. For the third year in a row, we will celebrate Good Friday with a joint service at Kearney First Christian Church. Easter begins with a sunrise service at Southpoint Cemetery. This is followed by a community breakfast hosted by the Orrick Methodist Church. Then we will celebrate the resurrection of our risen savior at 8:15 am and 10:45 am. Special activities are planned for our preschool and elementary children during the Sunday School hour. We have invitational postcards with this information on them. Please take some and invite others to join us.



#### MAUNDY THURSDAY PRAYER VIGIL

Why are we holding a Maundy Thursday Prayer Vigil? On Passover, after the feet washing and last supper, Jesus needed a time of prayer and asked three of his disciples to accompany him and pray while he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane.

In all four of the gospels, we see Jesus praying prior to his betrayal in the Garden of Gethsemane. There are many prayers of Jesus chronicled in the Bible, and there are many lessons we can learn from those prayers and the way He taught us to pray. But no other account of Jesus' prayer life is as detailed in scripture and as revealing or personal than when He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane.

In both Matthew 26:36-46 (NIV) and Mark 14:32-42 (NIV), we read similar accounts of this prayer. Jesus brings his disciples Peter, James, and John to the garden and asks them to stay and keep watch with him. We read that three times in a row Jesus leaves to pray, and his disciples aren't able to stay awake. During these times, Jesus prays:

"My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will (Matthew 26:39b NIV)."

"My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it, may your will be done (Matthew 26:42b NIV)."

In Mark 14:36 (NIV), Jesus calls out "Abba, Father." In Aramaic, "Abba" is like saying something more like "daddy or papa." In saying this, Jesus is claiming his position as a son and raising his hands to his father for help. In Luke 22:39-46 (NIV), we see the same cry to God, but Luke focuses on two other details. In Luke 22:43-44 (NIV) he notes that:

"An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground."

He needed strength. The toll of the stress and anxiety was weighing on Jesus to the point that He was sweating blood. This condition is called <a href="hematidrosis">hematidrosis</a>, and it can be caused by extreme distress or fear. In Luke's account, we see even more how Jesus is feeling and the physical strain in this moment before He is betrayed, stands trial, and is nailed to the cross.

John's account of Jesus praying focuses on a prayer prior to entering the Garden of Gethsemane. We read about Jesus praying in John 17:1-26 (NIV) for different groups of people. First, He acknowledges the "hour has come" for the Son of God to be glorified by "finishing the work" He has come to do. Second, He prays for his disciples to be protected as they take the truth into the world. Finally, He prays for those who will believe in Him through the message delivered through his disciples. This prayer includes everyone who believes Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus prays for the unity of believers and that the world would know that God sent Jesus because of these believers.

In all four gospels, Jesus is praying in preparation for what is to come. And in Matthew 26:38 (NIV), He says that his "soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death." Reading this almost feels like we're reading about a part of Jesus that we aren't supposed to know about. It's a different side to him, one that reveals Jesus' inner thoughts in the hours leading up to the events that would set in motion His journey to the cross.

The gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke show Jesus in despair but submitting to the will of God. John's gospel shows Jesus looking ahead to the lives of his disciples after his sacrifice and how their message about Him will impact the world.

So - we are holding a prayer vigil to follow Jesus' example of praying before the events of Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday. A sign up sheet was circulated in the worship services along with a scriptural prayer guide. If you did not get a prayer guide, see attachment to this newsletter.
