MORNING TIME ON THE PORCH

SERMON SUMMARY

Luke 24; Matthew 28; Mark 16; John 20 – 40 Days

On sabbatical this week.

CALL TO WORSHIP

Read Psalm 23:5-6

Elder Phil Boude filled the pulpit for Pastor Art. He presented a sermon on "Forty Days between Resurrection & Ascension." This time period is covered in all the gospels (Luke 24; Matthew 28; Mark 16 and John 20). Everything Jesus did or said was important and relevant to our lives. Phil spent some time reviewing the importance of the empty tomb and the cross and their importance in God's redemptive plan. Read Philippians 2:8-11. Christ's obedience brought glory to the Father. Mystery was resolved through Jesus' resurrection. Read Colossians 1:20-28. By proclaiming Christ and teaching others, we are perfected through Christ Jesus. Read Luke 24:1. It all started on the first day. Verse 5 reveals more than one woman witnessed the empty tomb. The women were grieving until they met Jesus. Jesus met them and sent them to the disciples with a message. Read Mark 16:10. Mary returned and greeted the mourning disciples. Verse 11 reveals that they didn't believe Mary. Unbelief or perhaps refusal to believe. Verse 13 talks about two men traveling away from Jerusalem. They did not recognize Jesus when he appeared to them. In verse 19, they describe Jesus as a prophet. In verses 25-27, Jesus rebukes them. Then Jesus explains himself beginning with Moses. There is more teaching by Jesus.

In John 20:8-9, we go back to the first day, confirming that no one understood the law of Moses requiring Christ to die and rise again. Read Colossians 1:19-20, 26-28. The resurrection proved that death and sin had been conquered. No one knew how it would happen - it was a


mystery. Confusion, scared about the unknown, moments of doubt and unbelief! The disciples dealt with all of this and we deal with this, too. Read John 20:19. On the evening of the first day, Jesus appeared to most of his disciples and convinced them it really was him. Verse 22, He breathes the Holy Spirit on them. It is our teacher just as it was their teacher. Read John 21:15-19. This passage is about Christ and Peter. Peter was dealing with unbelief and guilt for denying Christ. Christ had a plan and Christ restores Peter to the godly man he was intended to be as a fisher of men. Matthew, Mark and Luke all record the great commission. Read Acts 1:2-8. After the 40 days, the disciples were told to wait for the promise (be baptized by the Holy Spirit). Jesus was seen many times, taught and did many wonders. Christ meets us where we are just as he met his disciples. He heals us and restores us where we are. He provides power and guidance through the Holy Spirit. He sends us out to share his message. No sin is greater than God's grace. There is the redeeming power of the blood of Jesus Christ. So when we struggle with doubt and unbelief, we have the record of the 40 days to encourage us and guide us. Read Romans 8:31. Praising God for Elder Phil Boude and his explanation of the message of encouragement the 40 days gave the disciples and us!
