SERMON SUMMARY

Peter's Sermon - Acts 2:14-39

This week Elder JC Claypool filled the pulpit for Pastor Art as his family was at the hospital for a medical emergency with Brooke. His sermon was entitled "Peter's Sermon," based on Acts 2:14-39. Before talking about Peter, he reviewed the post 40 day resurrection sermons given by Elders Phil Boude and Tim O'Dell. He stated that speaking in tongues actually brought clarity and unity in the body of Christ rather than confusion. In order to understand the power and purpose of Peter's sermon, he reviewed the events of the Bible highlighting Peter's life.

In Matthew 4:18, Peter was called by Christ to be a fisher of men. In Matthew 14:22, Peter walked on water to get to Jesus but sank when he took his eyes off Jesus. In Matthew 16:13-20, Peter acknowledged that Jesus was Christ, the son of the living God. Then Jesus announced that Peter was the rock and that the church would be built on this foundation. In Matthew 17:1-13, Peter was a witness to the transfiguration. There are a lot of things to be learned about Peter in Matthew 26. Vs 31-35, Jesus predicts Peter's denial of Him. Vs 36-41, we know that Peter was chosen to accompany Jesus to the Garden of Gethsemane, where he and the other disciples fell asleep. Vs 47-56, reveals Peter's temper as he cuts off the servant's ear during the arrest of Jesus. Vs 69-75, records the details of Peter's denial of Christ 3 times before the cock crows. In John 21:1-14, Peter leads the others as they break bread together then go out to fish during the night. In John 21:15-19, we see

With this background, we know that Peter preached a powerful sermon. That he backed up his sermon with scripture from the Old Testament. The speaking in tongues was an act of God. Pentecost was a day that prophecy was fulfilled. He quotes David from Psalm 16. Verses 36-38 emphasized the importance of repentance and baptism. All that Peter went through changed him and allowed him to reach 3,000 for the Lord in one day. We have no idea what God will do through each of us if we allow the Holy Spirit full reign in our lives. Thanking God for Elder JC Claypool and his sermon on Peter's life and surrender to God for God's glory!
