#### SERMON SUMMARY

Memorial Stones – Joshua 3 & 4

Pastor Art felt the Lord leading him to preach out of Joshua 3 on "Memorial Stones." Our job as Christians is to tell the story of Jesus. Memorial Day seemed an appropriate time to revisit the book of Joshua. Memorial Day is a reminder to honor and respect those who sacrificed all for us.

When God makes a promise, He fulfills it. Every prophecy in the Bible has been fulfilled except one. The return of Christ is the only unfulfilled prophecy. We are waiting knowing that it will be fulfilled.

The book of Joshua comes on the heels of the time the Israelites travelled in the wilderness for 40 years. Why so long? Because they didn't trust God, except for Joshua and Caleb. All the adults who had crossed the Red Sea fleeing Egypt had died. Read Psalm 46:10. There are more prayers earnestly lifted to God in emergency or crisis situations than when we are waiting in line to ride amusement rides or purchase items. The first part of Joshua chapter 3 has three focal points. The first is waiting. It is important to communicate with God and wait for His answer. The second is understanding the way or to view where you are going. This reminds us that Jesus is the way! And third, is the importance of congregating. When the Israelites were all together, they were told to repent and be cleansed from sin (sanctification). Forgiveness is how we get into


heaven and away from sin. Read Proverbs 3:5-6. God makes a way.
